come and rise up from the grave.**

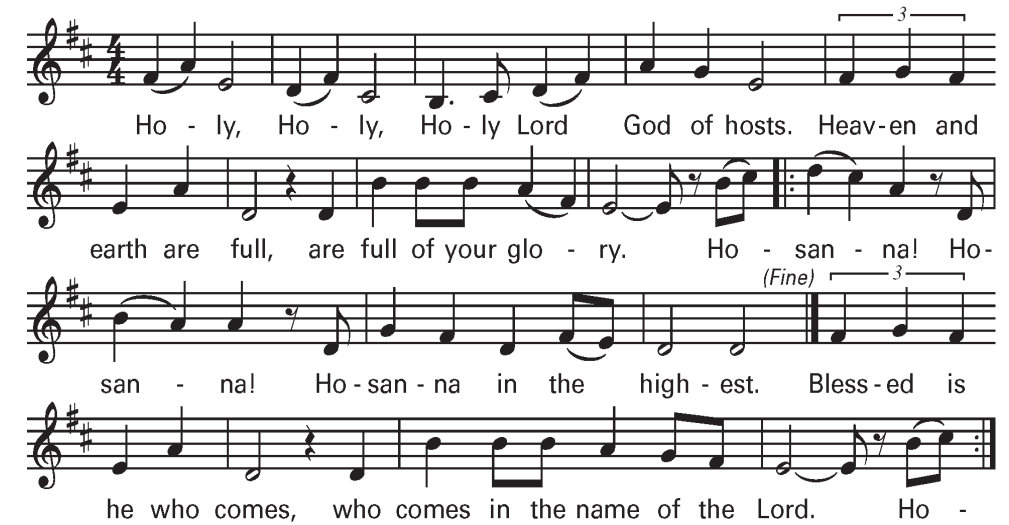
Beneath the weight of all our sin,
