A NOTE FROM FR. MARK

Happy Epiphany of the Lord! On this day we celebrate that Christ is revealed as being for all people. The magi, whose story we hear, are in the vanguard of all who are not Jewish, and yet who God loves, saves and calls to himself.

During my homily last weekend, on the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God, I pointed out how St. Luke in his gospel tells us Mary "kept all these things, reflecting upon them in her heart," and that the beginning of the New Year is an ideal time to do some reflecting ourselves. I shared 10 questions for reflection, hoping one of them would land in your heart, for you to keep and reflect upon. After Masses last weekend, many of you asked if I could provide the questions in written form. I gladly do so. As I mentioned, these questions were put together by author and Professor Don Whitney, founder of The Center for Biblical Study. I hope you find them of value.

- 1. What is one thing you could do this New Year to increase your enjoyment of God?
- 2. What is the most humanly impossible thing you will ask God to do this year?
- 3. What is the single most important thing you could do to improve the quality of your family life this year?
- 4. In which spiritual discipline (e.g. prayer, spiritual reading, silence, study, fasting, almsgiving, worship, confession, chastity, proper use of material things, etc.) do you most want to make progress this year, and what will you do about it?
- 5. What is the single biggest time-waster in your life, and what will you do about it this year?
- 6. What is the most helpful way you could strengthen your church?
- 7. For whose salvation will you pray most fervently this year?
- 8. What is the most important way you will, by God's grace, try to make this year different from last year?
- 9. What one thing could you do to improve your prayer life this year?
- 10. What single thing that you plan to do this year will matter most in ten years? In eternity?

Let us keep each other in prayer as we move into 2023. May we encounter the God who loves us in enjoyable, authentic, and life changing ways this New Year!
