



AN EASTER LETTER FROM FR. MARK

He is Risen! Alleluia! Happy Easter! On this radiant and joyful day, more than any other, mercy has triumphed, we are forgiven, we have been redeemed. God's reckless and invincible love has raised Jesus from the tomb victorious. We live in this glorious truth: God has triumphed over all that would destroy us, and through his Son, the Risen One, and the gift of the Holy Spirit, invites us to enter into a deep and lasting friendship with Him. This is truly good news in these days when there is so much darkness, pain and hopelessness in our world.

There are those among us those who have experienced God's love in a life-changing way this Easter! We celebrate with our brothers and sisters who are a special sign to us of the presence of the Risen Christ. At the Great Vigil of Easter, proud family members, friends, sponsors, and the entire community rejoiced as **David Ong, Jamie McKean, and Rodney Gilchrist** entered the life-giving waters of Baptism and became a new creation in Christ. Then, along with **Alexander Gilchrist, Bernadette A. Prado Rios, Danielle Hicks, Edward Kilroy IV, Ella La Rosa, Gina Spaulding, Mike Clinebell, Nicholas Wilson, Sydney Collignon and Troy Dameron**, celebrated the Sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharist. We congratulate all those who have celebrated their faith in an extraordinary way this Easter. In a world where faith is often seen as an irrelevant or antiquated idea, they have proclaimed boldly the difference faith in the Risen Christ has made in their life and can make in the lives of others. We also welcome all those who have joined us as guests and visitors on this joyful day! We are delighted that you have come to celebrate with us, the most important event of our faith. Please know you are welcome to join us regularly throughout the year as we explore, live and struggle to put into our daily lives what the wonderful reality of the resurrection means for us.

As Pope Francis has said:

"This is the culmination of the Gospel, it is the Good News par excellence: Jesus, who was crucified, is risen! This event is the basis of our faith and our hope. If Christ were not raised, Christianity would lose its very meaning; the whole mission of the Church would lose its impulse, for this is the point from which it first set out and continues to set out ever anew. The message which Christians bring to the world is this: Jesus, Love incarnate, died on the cross for our sins, but God the Father raised him and made him the Lord of life and death. In Jesus, love has triumphed over hatred, mercy over sinfulness, goodness over evil, truth over falsehood, life over death.

In every human situation, marked by frailty, sin and death, the Good News is no mere matter of words, but a testimony to unconditional and faithful love: it is about leaving ourselves behind and encountering others, being close to those crushed by life's troubles, sharing with the needy, standing at the side of the sick, elderly and the outcast... Love is more powerful, love gives life, love makes hope blossom in the wilderness."

Today, and for the next seven weeks of the Easter season, until the Solemnity of Pentecost on May 28, we celebrate and explore what the resurrection of Christ means in our lives and enjoy the new life we are promised in the Scriptures, Sacraments, light, water, prayer, song and more. There is no season of the year more joyful. Sons and Daughters, all children of God, rejoice! Alleluia!
